1.0 Overview

As at 25 May 2018 the EU General Data Protection Regulation (EU GDPR) enters into force, bringing a number of changes with regard to data protection. In parallel, Switzerland is also revising its data protection legislation. The new Data Protection Act can be expected to be based largely on EU provisions.

3.0 Details

Security and transparency are of utmost importance for SIX. Accordingly, as at the end of May 2018 SIX will implement the rules of the EU GDPR across the Group, both within the EU and outside it. In this way we will ensure that your data is processed in accordance with the legal requirements at all times.
